
#### EarMaster Pro 5 - A Review

Published by <u>eMedia Music</u>, EarMaster Pro is an eartraining program for musicians and students at all levels. It's important for all musicians, particularly those playing by ear, improvising or sight-singing. The program has 651 progressive lessons, both standard and jazz, in 12 areas to

train you to recognize intervals, chords, scales and rhythms. It supports MIDI or microphone inputs as well as on-screen controls. You can select individual exercises or use the "tutor" which will start you with simple exercises, grade your performance and take you to the next level when you're ready. It's the best of its kind that I've seen.

It comes on a CD with both PC and Mac (OS 10.4.11+) versions. There's a trial version



on their <u>web site</u>, and also a school version that runs on a server to support multiple users on a network.

# PUBLIC DOMAIN CD (PD CD) February 2009

For newcomers, **Shareware** is defined as programs you can try out, and if you like them, pay the developer the shareware fee. Often features may be limited until you pay the fee and get the registration code. **Freeware** is defined as free programs, but retain copyright control by the developer. **Public domain** is defined as free programs that don't have copyright control.

If you are new to the group, I have researched and written the monthly PD CD column in the newsletter for many years. I also make the physical CD that you can purchase for \$5 at the back table at our monthly meetings. My columns are also on the club's Wiki. The January- February 2009 CD will be available at the February meeting.

Well, we're into the year 2009 for real now. There are eight programs this month.

**Billiards.zip** Billiards game. OSX 10.4/10.5 PPC and Intel. Relatively simple game, but it works.

**BookHunter\_0.8.3.dmg** Program to catalog, organize and sort book collections. Freeware. OSX 10.5 only PPC or Intel.

**FileUtilsCM.dmg.gz** A configurable Menu (CM) item that will set different file or folder attributes. You can do things like toggle the usually invisible file extensions on or off, or change the file type and creator codes. This is not something for beginners to be playing with. 10.3.9 to 10.5 PPC/Intel

**MacGourmet-2.4.0.dmg** Updated version of the recipe, cooking and wine note program. iPhone and iTouch support has been added to send information to them. Improved import of other cooking databases such as Yum has also been added. 10.4/10.5 PPC/Intel

**MacOSaiX.dmg** Wow! This is a great little program. Take an original image then also select a image source which should be a collection of

images like a iPhoto collection. Then this program uses the image sources images to make a mosaic that looks like the original image. OSX 10.2 (with limitations) 10.3 to 10.5 (best). And it's Freeware!!

MSHVolcanoCam-1.wdgt.zip Another Freeware program, but actually a Widget. It lets you look at Mount St Helens volcano cameras on your computer. Since its a widget, its will require OSX 10.4 or higher.

**SpamSieve-2.7.3.dmg** This utility program to filter spam from most e-mail programs. (Apple Mail, Outlook Express, Eudora, etc.) OSX 10.4/10.5 PPC/Intel

**TimeLog\_4.4.2.zip** A program integrated with iCal for logging time charging on events (jobs) that you perform. This is OSX 10.5 only

#### iMovie '09 Seems to Fix Everything from iMovie '08

When Apple introduced iMovie '08, the video editor was nothing like previous versions. Completely rewritten and boasting a new interface, it lacked features that iMovie users had grown accustomed to: audio editing lost capabilities that had been gradually added to iMovie over several versions; themes were removed; iDVD chapter markers disappeared (as well as the capability to send a project directly to iDVD); and more (see "New iLife '08 Revealed, .Mac Upgraded, 2007-08-13). iMovie '08 had its upsides - support for importing AVCHD footage and making easy color adjustments come to mind - but it was very much a 1.0 application.

Based on what Phil Schiller presented during the Macworld Expo keynote, iMovie '09 looks to be the program we were expecting last year. A new Precision Editor lets you fine-tune edits in an expanded visual way. When you drag and drop a clip from the Event library onto a clip in your movie, a new action pop-up menu appears with options to replace the existing clip, insert the new clip in the middle of the existing one, or just add the audio from the new clip. (Other options include green-screen and picture-in-picture.)

Video stabilization is a welcome new feature that can take the shake out of handheld footage, something that will be especially useful for owners of small Flip camcorders that lack built-in image stabilization features. (iMovie also improves compatibility with the Flip MinoHD.)

iMovie's engineers have clearly spent some time traveling (or thinking about traveling),

because several features are ideal for travel videos. Animated travel maps, available in a few different themes, let you specify locations on a map or globe and create Indiana Jones-style markers that extend from place to place. Themes have also made a reappearance in iMovie, and at first glance they seem more interesting and flexible than those that appeared in iMovie HD.

Other welcome improvements include the return of iDVD chapter markers and direct-to-iDVD exporting, iPhoto Event matching, an intriguing new archive feature for making copies of tapeless footage, multi-touch gesture support, the capability to adjust multiple clips at once, and, at last, the return of fast and slow motion. Still missing are support for exporting footage back to tape and the capability to adjust volume levels within a clip. A <u>full list of new features</u> can be found on Apple's Web site.

iMovie '09 is part of iLife '09, which will ship in late January 2009 for \$79 or \$99 for a family pack. [It is selling now.] Also available then will be the Mac Box Set for \$169, which includes iLife '09, iWork '09, and Mac OS X 10.5 Leopard. New Macs will continue to ship with iLife for free. If you purchase a new machine between 06-Jano9 and 31-Mar-09 that does not include iLife '09, you can upgrade it for \$9.95 through Apple's iLife Up-to-Date program.

# Apple ranks 14th in Forbes' "25 Fastest Growing Tech Companies"

Record sales of Macs, iPods and iPhones pushed Apple into a 14th place showing in Forbes magazine's **annual list** of America's fastest growing tech companies.

That Apple made the list at all is phenomenal given its age – 32 years – and its substantial size. Apple's annual \$33 billion in revenues far exceeded every other company on the list save No. 2 Google, which had 2008 revenue of \$21.7 billion. Each company's rank is based on its annualized sales growth from the previous five years. Apple's was 40 percent, Google's 72 percent. The No. 1 company, Illumina, grew at an eyepopping 110 percent.

A supplemental article on newcomers to the list says Apple "is growing more like a technology start-up than a big company."

Other companies of interest on the list include No. 23 Akamai (which Apple employs to deliver its digital content over the Internet) and No. 25 Genentech (CEO Arthur Levinson serves on Apple's board along with Google's Eric Schmidt).

Microsoft execs looking over the Forbes list may not like what they see. In addition to big rivals Apple and Google, there's No. 11 Red Hat, which competes with Windows in the enterprise market with an assortment of Linux-based products. Microsoft could take heart from finding one company on the list that does in fact sell a great deal of Windows software. Unfortunately that company is No. 22 Symantec, which specializes in PC security software like Norton Anti-Virus.

"This is a good time to mention that you can get a free iPhoto plug-in that lets you upload to the SBAMUG website Photo Gallery very easily and directly from your iPhoto.

Download it here: http://zwily.com/iphoto Then just double click the installer to install.

To upload photos from iPhoto:

Select your photos, and/or make an album of them. Choose "Export" from "File" menu (or "Share" menu) Click the "Gallery" tab.

And click "Add Gallery" from that menu.

Your Gallery URL is http://sbamug.com/gallery/v/YOUR-USERNAME (substitute your own username, of course!)

Choose what album you want to add to, and/or create a new album. It's perfectly OK to create a new album inside another album, for organization. For example, you might make an album for a vacation, and then create an album inside for each place/family you visit. Albums are like folders and you can put other albums inside of them.


To upload faster choose to scale your photos no larger than 1024 x 1024. That's the maximum size that this photo gallery is allowed to display anyway. Export titles and comments if you want to. Actually, that is a great feature, I just type my comments for each photo into my iPhoto, then they show up on my Gallery with captions! :-) Click Export and let it rip!

To share with friends, just tell them the URL (substitute your own username, of course!). That's all they need to know:
