MacJournal 7.0.2: Create, maintain, and blog a personal journal. You can drag PDFs, QuickTime movies, images, audio, and more into the program. Publish to Blogger, Tumblr and more. Mac OS 10.13+ Free https://danschimpf.com

Mactracker 7.9.3: This database program provides details on every mac ever made, as well as things like keyboards, displays, printers, scanners, etc. OSX 10.10+ Free https://mactracker.ca

pdf2csv12.5.17: Utility program that converts bank statements in the PDF form to comma separated values (CSV). CSV files can then be imported into many financial programs or spreadsheets. OSX 10.12+ \$24.95 https://www.moneythumb.com

SwitchResX 4.10.0: Switch monitor resolutions to values, not the normal defaults the operating system gives you. Disable monitors without disconnecting. OSX 10.9+\$16.00

iPadPro 2020

I was planning on buying the iPadPro to replace my old Mac Air. However, I wanted to test it in person first to decide about options. But with everything shut down, it was put on hold.

I read a great review in the July 2020 issue of Macworld, "A Modest Improvement On A Great Tablet". Leif Johnson references features of the 2018 iPadPro: Face ID, improved Apple pencil, USB-C port, and faster processor. This review of the 12.9-inch model, that still has most of the same features as the 2018: TrueTone display and ProMotion 120 HZ refresh rate which makes scrolling smoother than other iPads. All 2020 configurations have more storage: 128 GB, 256 GB, 512 GB, and 1TB RAM, a new A122Z chip with 8 cores, optional new Magic Keyboard case and Apple keyboard, a built-in trackpad, and ultra-wide lens camera system.

A bonus feature is a LIDAR time-of-flight sensor to improve speed and accuracy of augmented reality. The article provides examples of the LIDAR improvements in tests by the author.

In another article, "Three Ways the iPad beats the Mac", Jason Snell compares using the iPadPro with a Mac laptop using Pixelmator Photo (\$5) on the iPad with Photos on a Mac and editing podcasts on both hardwares.

So, when the stores open again, I will explore the iPadPro in person with the intention of purchasing one.
