**CDRViewer 3 3.6.1:** Utility app to read and convert CorelDRAW CDR, CMX files as well as Visio files. Converts to PDF (free) and EPS with pro version. Pro version also gives no size limits. OS 10.13+ Free (Pro \$11.99 in app purchase) Mac App store

**Default Folder X 5.6.3:** This program has been around awhile. Attaches toolbar to open/save dialog boxes. Tools are things like recently used folders, select favorites etc. Mac OS 10.10+ \$34.96 https://www.stclairsoft.com/DefaultFolderX/index.html

**Economix 4.3.0:** Program to manage bank accounts. Gives progressive balance and lets you enter expenses into categories Lists total credits/debits per month. Mac OS 10.13+ Free

**Equation Systems 1.1:** App to solve linear equations using the Gauss-Jordan method. MacOS 10.9+ \$1.99 Mac App Store

**HEIC Converter 2.1.2:** Converts the new HEIC image format to JPEG or PNG formats. Preserves image metadata. Mac OS 10.15+ Free Mac App Store

**iSchedule 1.1.9:** Let you build a schedule. In the form of a table. Alerts you if duration exceeds limits you have set. Save as text files for reference. Mac OS 10.11+ \$1.99 Mac App store.

# Apple Declares the iPhone 6 Plus "Vintage"

If you're still rocking an iPhone 6 Plus, you officially have a vintage iPhone, as reported by Macworld. Once Apple declares a product to be "vintage," Apple and Apple-authorized repair shops may no longer be able to obtain parts for it, except in places like France with stronger consumer protection laws. Apple moves products into the vintage category once it hasn't distributed the product for a minimum of 5 years, up to 7 years. After 7 years, products are declared "obsolete" and lose all support. Apple hasn't sold the iPhone 6 Plus since September 2016. Ironically, the iPhone 6 has avoided the vintage list because Apple re-released it in parts of Asia in 2018.

#### SBAMUG CLUB HISTORY (PART 3 of 3)

Hopefully you have read part 1 and part 2 of these articles. If not, go to the older newsletters and read the articles. We were at timeframe of the year 2000.

Dave Nathanson continued as President through the year 2003. We had elections and Glenn Terry became the President. We continued to meet at the Knob Hill Community Center.

In 2003, the long running saga of deciding on and obtaining a larger projection screen started and continued into 2004. We are still using it. (Or were when we were at the VFW in person)

Glenn Terry continued as President though 2007. In January 2008 LJ Palmer became President. In 2009 Glenn Terry again became President.

The Knob Hill Community Center was a former elementary school that was leased to the city by the Redondo Beach school district. The club was informed that the center could not be guaranteed beyond June of 2009. So, for several months before March 2009, we looked for another place to hold meetings. In May 2009 we began to meet at the VFW Hall in Lomita. We technically still are with the VFW in terms of a meeting place. More about this in a bit.

In January 2010, LJ Palmer became President again and continued though 2011. In January 2012, Arnold Silver became President. In January 2015, Clarence Baisdon became President. In January 2016, Robert (Kent) McDonald became President. He continues as President, having been re-elected for 2022.

In April 2020 our meetings went virtual online using ZOOM. This was due to Covid-19 and the VFW being closed. We have continued with ZOOM meetings since then. Returning to the VFW when the covid situation improves is

possible, but has not been decided as of this writing.

Well, that's a brief history of the SBAMUG. I haven't included the names of all the other volunteers - Vice Presidents, Secretaries, Treasurers, Membership, Programming (ie finding speakers), Newsletter Editors, USPS Liaison, Greeters, Member Development, Directors-at-Large - naming all these other volunteers would take up a lot of space, but should be thanked. Our club newsletters since 2005 are available on our website if you want to dig into this information.

As is true of most computer user groups, our numbers have decreased over the years. Pre-internet, it was difficult to get answers to computer questions. While magazines could provide a good review of a program, they could not give a live demo of the program. That and answering questions was why inperson demos were popular with our user group and others around the world. In the early years we had many members that were professionals in the graphics/desktop publishing arena.

Again, I am hoping someone can fill in the early pre-1998 details of our club. It would also help to know the month we moved from Ticor Title to the Pacific Elementary School.

If I get any new or corrected information, I will follow up with another article.

# Has Apple Abandoned the iPod touch?

Apple introduced the current seventh-generation <u>iPod touch</u> in May 2019, making it 1000 days old, <u>according to MacRumors</u>. Even then, it was a modest update, as Adam Engst noted in "<u>New iPod touch Gains A10 Chip and 256 GB Configuration</u>" (28 May 2019). It is the only iPod still in production, and it's one of Apple's least-expensive devices, starting at \$199.

Will Apple ever release an updated iPod touch? The current model is compatible with the current iOS 15, but if iOS 16 were to drop it off the train, that might be incentive enough for Apple to release an update with a moremodern processor. The iPod touch would seem to be ideal for some kids, but we assume that sales are minimal or Apple would have treated it like the base-level iPad, which receives regular hardware updates.
